Catalyst



Chestnut Hill is an internationally significant treasure, with hundreds of acres of natural, scenic, privately-held open space in the Wissahickon watershed and thousands of unique historic buildings. As pressure builds toward a vastly altered neighborhood, the Conservancy is stepping up conservation and planning efforts that will benefit Chestnut Hill - and communities throughout the region.

To support this essential work, the Conservancy is engaging community leaders and supporters at the CATALYST level of the Leadership Circle.

350+ acres of private watershed land unprotected from development pressure*

85% of Chestnut Hill's historic architecture unprotected from demolition

The Chestnut Hill Conservancy is the <u>only</u> organization in our area to advocate for sustainability, urban land conservation, and historic preservation

Hundreds of acres of environmentally significant open space and thousands of historic buildings remain vulnerable to intensifying development pressures and over-permissive zoning. As many as 1,000 new homes could be built *by-right* in the many subdividable, environmentally critical parcels in Chestnut Hill. Efforts to conserve, preserve and manage redevelopment have never been so important.

150 acres of open space and dozens of buildings have been protected by the Conservancy so far. As a leader within our Leadership Circle, 50% of your Catalyst membership goes directly toward the work of the Conservancy's Conservation and Easements Program, run in partnership with Friends of the Wissahickon.
